Be sure to attend the October meeting: President and Treasurer positions are up for election. If anyone is interested in running for these LRA officer positions please contact the Secretary Matt, AF9Q before October 1.

The board authorized a \$300 expenditure to pick up a used Motorola repeater that will act as a backup for any of our existing systems. **Kevin, N9OIG**, our technical director, is now in possession of this equipment and it is in great condition ready for service.

A \$100 expenditure was also authorized to procure a better LCD projector for use at our quarterly meetings. We hope to have this ready for our October 29th meeting later this month.

Our new Walworth receive site for the 442.000 repeater has been providing much needed western area receive coverage. You may access this site by switching to a 114.8 PL. This is linked into our main site full time via Allstar.

Full time RF access to LRA's 442.000 wide area repeater is also available in the Burlington area and is available via the 442.850 (88.5) repeater operated and owned by **Robin, WB9COW**. He also provides Echolink access (check with Robin for details). Use this site for handheld radio access when visiting the famous Fred's Burgers in Burlington.

Supporting Bernie on our SKYWARN committee is Steve, N9SEB, Rick, KC9UJO, and Dwayne, N9PYA.

The SKYWARN network is designed as a "liaison net" during severe weather operations, serving as a collection point where local spotter networks (operating on their local repeaters and frequencies) can collect and relay reports and information to the NWS in Norman. The local net control stations gather information from individual spotters and relay that information to the NWS via the liaison net.

The "UN-NET" is hatching many more "Chickens" almost every day. **A new record** was set in April when K9SO, as moderator, logged in 61 participants blasting away at the old record of 54. We're rapidly approaching the 40,000 check-in mark.

This unusual "Un-Net" is gathering continent-wide attention and without a doubt has been one of the big reasons for our club's phenomenal success this past couple of years.

It has been a highly successful way new hams have introduced themselves to the locals and dozens of new hams have recorded the Happy Hour as their very first QSO.

Going on its 4th year, this is a fun, largely unstructured but moderated "Un-Net" where the moderator writes the often crazy rules. Check in **every day** after work with your call sign and share your happy thoughts. It's strangely addictive.

This group meets daily on both the LRA 442.000 and 147.240 Allstar linked repeaters at 5:00pm sharp and lasts for about an hour. Be prepared to share your happy thoughts for the day. It is moderated regularly by **K9SO**, **K9WBT**, **KC9UJO**, **N9PYA**, **and KD1Z**. Lately, **Robin**, **WB9COW**, **Craig**, **KD9UQE**, **Kevin**, **KB9LLV**, **Bernie**, **N9AZA**, **Mike**, **K9MWG**, and even **Derrick**, **VE5SD** from Saskatoon have been moderating too.

Repeaters from Maine, Saskatoon, Milwaukee, Burlington, and others regularly link in to us. If you're out of radio range, log in via Allstar nodes 511680 and 511681. WB9COW/R has Echolink connections too.


Lakes Area Amateur Radio Club (L.A.A.R.C.) in Elkhorn




All non-emergency vehicular traffic on any road west of I-77 in western NC is still forbidden as I write this newsletter (Sept 30). Quite the mess just west of me.




Bill, KD1Z, posted this picture of an exploded ICOM hand-held radio used in the Hezbollah attack last month. Be careful how you charge those radios!

Ham radio operators are allocated 26 bands of radio frequencies, ranging from 1.8 Megahertz to 275 Gigahertz. The band used determines how far the operator can communicate, from across town to around the world or to satellites in space.

Les Hamilton (GM3ITN) was a Scottish ham radio operator who first alerted the British government that the Falkland Islands had been invaded by Argentina. During the occupation he was the only person in Britain to be in regular radio contact with the islanders.

Ham Radio stuff:

So you want to be a HAM?

Ham radio has a legacy of over 100 years. Learn about the legacy and the "private" Ham Radio jargon to impress your fellow Amateurs. **Charlie, K2OC** (my brother) sent me the following link leading to an excerpt from a book. It's a fairly long read, but very interesting and worthwhile: <u>Ham Radio Culture</u>

... also, regarding the history of our very own "MIA" committee:

In the early 1940s, wireless hobbyists trying to change their image from tinkering pranksters to upstanding citizens volunteered to help the FCC track down unlicensed operators. The American Radio Relay League (ARRL) spoke of lending assistance with enforcement as a tactic to keep hams on good terms with regulators. When the FCC caught a notorious "unlicensed punk" in 1941, the ARRL chided members for not having found him and called for improved "policing" within the hobby. The League reasoned that "our interests require that we show no tolerance either to bootleggers or to violators of the FCC's special orders." Defense of community boundaries further motivated hams to turn in illegal operators. Monthly club bulletins offered a timely format for calling attention to mischievous on-air behavior. The newsletter of the Northern California DX Club, for instance, exposed an operator suspected of using false credentials after confirmation cards a member sent to him had been returned marked "addressee unknown." Joining together in this way to ostracize rule-breakers from the on-air community increased solidarity among upstanding wireless operators.

Baofeng has a new 10w dual band handheld radio. It's been out for a while, but now the price is just \$55 on Amazon <u>HERE</u>. But read the reviews first before you buy. They may not actually do 10 watts.
